

Vaccinations in Kosovo Serb communities

COVID-19 VACCINATION



Vaccinations in Serb communities began in the four (4) municipalities in the north of Kosovo at the end of December 2020

The first doses of the 'Pfizer' vaccine were administered to individuals over 65 years of age.

Following a strongly negative reaction from Pristina due to the (allegedly) illegal importation of vaccines into Kosovo, their administration was halted and transferred to healthcare providers in central Serbia

Locations

- Starting from mid-January, vaccinations have been administered to residents of Serbian communities in Kosovo at three centers – Raška, Kuršumlja and Bujanovac.
- Raška was designated as the vaccination center for the four municipalities of the north of Kosovo
- Bujanovac was designated as the vaccination center for the east of Kosovo
- Kuršumlja was designated as the vaccination center for western and central Kosovo.

Organized vaccination

-  Registrations for vaccination are carried out in health clinics and centers in Kosovo that work within the Serbian system or over the internet, and over time walk-in appointments were permitted without the need for prior registration.
-  Residents are most frequently transported to vaccination centers by buses organized free-of-charge by Serbian institutions or by private automobile.
-  Aside from members of the Serb community, members of the Roma, Gorani and Albanian communities in possession of Serbian identity documents have also received vaccines from centers in Serbia.
-  As of the 15th of June 2021, 24,000 individuals from Kosovo had received one dose of the vaccine at centers in central Serbia, while over 22,500 citizens had received a second dose.
